Jeff Wolfsberg **Safe Prom and Teens**

How is your teen feeling about the prom? What is your teen most excited about? What are they most nervous about?

Who is your child's date and/or group of friends with whom they'll be attending the prom with? Does your teen know them well? Do you? What are the conversations you need to have with your teen based on age, values and beliefs of your teen and this group?

Have you discussed your expectations regarding alcohol use, drinking and driving, and other unsafe situations?

Have you met/do you know the parents of your child's date or prom group?

Know your teen's pre-prom and post-prom plans. Make sure you and your teen are clear about details and expectations. If you decide to extend curfew, know where they are, who they are with, who is in charge, and when they will be home. Students often want to take post-prom plans on the road where supervision may not be adequate. Do not rent rooms for post-prom celebrations without proper supervision.
